Take on Old Man Winter: Driving and Survival Guide

- Always fasten seatbelts and properly secure children in approved child safety seats.
- NEVER pass snow plows or plow trains – the untreated road is in front of them, the treated road is behind.
- Turn on headlights to see and be seen. Maryland law requires headlight use when windshield wipers are in operation.
- Increase following Distance from vehicles in front of you.
- Slow down. Speed limits are established for ideal weather conditions, not snow and ice. Four-wheel drive provides traction on snow, but not on ice.
- Never abandon your vehicle. If you get into trouble and need to stop the car, move as far off the roadway as possible. For assistance, dial #77 from your cell phone. Report abandoned vehicles as they can endanger motorists and slow winter operations.

Get Your Vehicle "Road Ready" for Winter

- Check battery for age and proper conditions to start vehicle on cold days.
- Inspect belts and coolant hoses for excessive wear, damage or leaks.
- Make sure tires have sufficient tread and are properly inflated.
- Check headlights, tail lights and turn signals to ensure proper operation.
- Keep the gas tank full to prevent gas line freezing.
- Keep windshield wiper reservoir full.

Remember to pack a survival kit that includes:

- A fully charged mobile phone.
- Jumper cables.
- Shovel and small bag of kitty litter or gravel for traction.
- Warm clothing and a blanket.
- Bottled water and snacks.
- Matches or lighter.
- A basic tool kit.
